


Dream Green is an East London based social enterprise. We're on a mission to make cities greener by giving everyday people the information, inspiration, and tools to plant in public places.

WHAT IS GUERRILLA GARDENING?

Guerrilla gardening is the global movement of people planting in public places. From scattering wildflower seeds onto road verges, to building community allotments on vacant lots, these peaceful acts of rebellion are where flower power meets people power.

WHAT ARE GUERRILLA GARDENS GOOD FOR?

Guerrilla gardens can create beauty, boost biodiversity, grow food, unite communities, support mental health, reduce heat waves, clean air, provide nature connection, and make a political statement – sometimes all at once!

IS GUERRILLA GARDENING ILLEGAL?

Despite what many assume, guerrilla gardening is not inherently illegal.

There's no law that specifically prohibits everyday people from autonomously planting in public places.

There *are* some laws that could be used against guerrilla gardeners, such as vandalism, trespass, public nuisance, public endangerment, and environmental laws (like not spreading invasive species). However it is very straightforward to design your guerrilla action so as to avoid such accusations.

Dream Green workshops and *Get Guerrilla Gardening* teach guerrilla gardening in ways that do not break these laws. Convictions for guerrilla gardening are essentially unheard of. In recent headline cases of guerrilla gardeners vs. the law – such as Ron Finley in 2010, and Djo BaNkuna in 2022 – the green-fingered vigilantes always win.

Not only that, you're increasingly unlikely to be so much as questioned in the first place, as attitudes evolve. A 2022 report in journal *Crime, Media, Culture* described guerrilla gardening as "a form of urban intervention that is broadly accepted and welcomed, even by those who enforce the law."

WHAT ARE SEED BOMBS?

Seed bombs are balls of (you guessed it) seeds – usually wildflowers – held together with clay and compost.

These pocketable pellets are a staple weapon in the guerrilla gardener's arsenal because they're effective and easy to use. Just throw them onto some bare soil, and let sun and rain take care of the rest. You can leave bright bursts of plant life in your wake – no time, hassle, or dirty knees required!
